Spend Compass - Data Analytics

Would you buy a home without checking sale prices in the area? What about buying a car without checking pricing? Most of us would agree those are bad ideas. Yet, when it comes to procurement, we are often less than optimally prepared.

Let's say you're looking to replace an aging freezer with a newer model. You've obtained three or four quotes - and kudos for that - but how do you really know that the lowest quote is a good deal?

What if you'd like to see if the price you are paying for copy paper has increased over the last six months? Is

there a way to do that without going back through all your old invoices and receipts?

Maybe you just want a quick way to get a picture of department spending trends for the past year. Is there an easy way to do that?



These are the types of situations that we haven't always had a good way to deal with, but we do now. Enter Spend Compass, our data mining tool.

With Spend Compass we can compare a

quoted price across our peer institutions to see what everyone else is paying. That allows us to evaluate the quote to see if we are really getting the best deal we can. Spend Compass also compares our spend within the University so we can see if prices on a particular item are steadily climbing. Failure to reallocate transactions is one of the most common mistakes cardholders make. Don't forget that you are required to reallocate charges to

the appropriate index/account code prior to the transaction feed date. The feed date is ten days after the charge is loaded in Banner.

Check your Banner notifications, you'll receive a message whenever you have new transactions to review/reallocate.
